



The meeting started with tours of the Kumeyaay-Ipai site. The docents, Jerry Green and Suzanne Emery, led two groups through the area. Suzanne Emery concentrated on the cultural and historical aspects of the local inhabitants and Jerry Green concentrated on the ecology and native plants. The docents Suzanne and Bob Emery, and Sandy and Bob Horan hosted us at the center.

The Meeting was called to order by Sherry Eberwein after the potluck dinner at 5:00 on December 6, 2009.

Jim Respass started by showing some photos he had taken of various rock art sites.

It was decided that we would have a photo share at our April meeting. People wanting to share should contact Greg if they need to use the equipment.

People were encouraged to become members this year so they could become charter members.

Sherry Eberwein explained the process by which the core committee chose the name "association" instead of "enthusiasts". We are now officially San Diego Rock Art Association.
