

## **“Water, a Metaphor for Life”**

Certain sequences in the art of many of Baja California's Great Mural Art panels suggest a belief in a cyclical hydrological water system that is also echoed among Southwestern Puebloans, the Western Shoshone, and others. Part of the cycle, namely how to get water—as the metaphor of life force—back up into the sky so it can return as rain, seems to be a theme that appears visually in some of the art.
