Rock Imagery of Bears Ears National Monument.

A Presentation by Wanda Raschkow

Wanda will provide an introduction to the rock imagery of southeastern Utah with a focus on the resources of Bears Ears National Monument. The Monument was established in 2016, reduced by the Trump administration in 2018, and recently restored by the Biden administration. There are at least 38,000 recorded archaeological sites within San Juan county, which includes Bears Ears. The rock imagery present in the area spans the Archaic, Ancestral Puebloan, historic Ute and Navajo, and early Pioneer periods. There also are some historic Civilian Conservation Corps inscriptions, and even an image of what some people have interpreted as an extinct mammoth.

Wanda worked seasonally as an archaeologist in Montana, Wyoming, and Utah before settling into a permanent position at the Bureau of Land Management's Palm Springs office. She later added Joshua Tree and Death Valley National Parks to her resume. Since 2017, Wanda has worked with Friends of Cedar Mesa—a non-profit based in Bluff, Utah, that works to protect and preserve the landscape and cultural resources of the Bears Ears region. She manages FCM's stewardship and Visit with Respect Ambassador programs.
